

## Protocol for the importation of samples of non-commercial character

#### Scope of application



Came into force May 13, 2020

### **Products of NON-ANIMAL origin**

## NOT INTENDED for consumption or commercialization

Samples without commercial value of products of non-animal origin intended for scientific purposes, for artistic activities, fairs and exhibitions, or for specific study or analysis with a view to undertaking a production process in the food industry, including the testing of machinery.

The CHED-D is issued by the operators responsible for the consignment (RFC). The purpose of the CHED is:

- (1) Pre-notify the relevant authorities of the border control post (BCP) of the consignment's arrival > Part I CHEDD en TRACES¹> "Sample" or "Artículo de Exposición"\*
- (2) For the relevant authorities to record the outcome of official controls performed and any decisions taken on that basis > Part II CHEDD at TRACES<sup>1</sup>

These shipments shall be exempt from:

- (a) Labeling
- (b) Registration in the General Sanitary Register of Food Companies and Foodstuffs (RGSEAA)
- (c) Hygiene requirements
- (d) Emergency measures, intensification of controls, and specific conditions or special measures<sup>2</sup>

## INTENDED for consumption or commercialization

Samples consisting of products of non-animal origin to be consumed or marketed in the context of specific studies or analyses, artistic activities, fairs or exhibitions.

The CHED-P is issued by the operators responsible for the consignment (RFC). The purpose of the CHED is:

- (1) Pre-notify the relevant authorities of the border control post (BCP) of the arrival of the consignment > Part I CHEDP en TRACES<sup>3</sup> > "Consumo humano"\*\*
- (2) Hygiene requirements
- (3) General Sanitary Register of Food and Food Companies (RGSEAA) for consignments for human consumption, not for marketing
- (4) Emergency measures, intensification of controls, and specific conditions or special measures depending on weight or destination<sup>2</sup>
- (5) For the competent authorities to record the outcome of official controls performed and any decisions taken on that basis > <u>Part II CHEDP at TRACES</u><sup>3</sup>

### Protocol for the importation of samples of non-commercial character

### **ANIMAL** products

Exempt from payment of fees for official controls<sup>4</sup>

## INTENDED for consumption or commercialization

Samples consisting of live insects or products of animal origin (meat, fish, honey, etc.) to be consumed or marketed

The CHED-P is issued by the operators responsible for the consignment (RFC). The purpose of the CHED is:

- Pre-notify the relevant authorities of the border control post (BCP) of the arrival of the consignment > Part I CHEDP in TRACES<sup>3</sup> Notificar al BCP > Parte I CHEDP en TRACES
- (2) From the list of third countries, which includes Canada
- (3) Animal health requirements 5
- (4) EU hygiene requirements 6
- (5) Sanitary certificate 7
- (6) Emergency measures, intensification of controls, and specific conditions or special measures depending on weight or destination <sup>2</sup>

For the relevant authorities to record the outcome of official controls performed and any decisions taken on that basis > Part II CHEDP in TRACES <sup>3</sup>

# NOT INTENDED for consumption or commercialization

#### **COMMERCIAL**

Samples of products of animal origin, by-products of animal origin or derived products, intended for specific study or analysis with a view to undertaking a production process in the food, pharmaceutical (human) or cosmetic industry, including machinery testing.

The CHED-P is issued by the operators responsible for the consignment (RFC). The purpose of the CHED is:

- Pre-notify the relevant authorities of the border control post (BCP) of the arrival of the consignment ><u>Part I CHEDP in TRACES</u><sup>3</sup> > "Muestra comercial"
- (2) Documentation
  - (a) Sanitary certificate 8
  - (b) Copy of commercial invoice
  - (c) Documents certifying the veracity of the center where the practice is to be carried out
  - (d) Proof of payment of fees
- (3) Sample requirements
  - (a) Label: "Commercial samples not fit for human consumption".
  - (b) From the "list of third countries" including Canada
  - (c) Sanitary certificate 8
  - (d) <u>Sealed consignment, transported without</u> <u>unloading or splitting and directly from BCP to</u> the place of destination <sup>9</sup>
- (4) For the relevant authorities to record the outcome of official controls performed and any decisions taken on that basis > Part II CHEDP in TRACES <sup>3</sup>
- (5) Completion of the study
  - (a) Sample elimination according to category 10
  - (b) Return to country of origin
- (6) If the samples are used for machinery testing: use of equipment

#### **SAMPLES or EXHIBITS**

Includes samples without commercial value of products of animal origin, by-products and derived products destined for artistic activities, fairs or exhibitions.

The CHED-P is issued by the operators responsible for the consignment (RFC). The purpose of the CHED is:

- (1) Pre-notify the relevant authorities of the border control post (BCP) of the arrival of the consignment >Part I CHEDP in TRACES 3 > Otros
- (2) Documentation
  - (a) copy of commercial invoice
  - (b) documents proving the veracity of the exhibition/event
- (3) Sample requirements
  - (a) Label: "Display articles not fit for human consumption".
  - (b) From the "list of third countries" including Canada
  - (c) Sanitary certificate
  - (d) BCP direct shipment to authorized user
  - (e) Packaging: description and animal species of origin, category of material, quantity, place of loading, name and address of consignor and consignee and authorization.
- (4) For the relevant authorities to record the outcome of official controls performed and any decisions taken on that basis > <u>Part II CHEDP in TRACES</u><sup>3</sup>
- (5) The exhibition ended
  - (a) Samples disposed of or used in accordance with Regulation (EC) No. 1069/2009 10
  - (b) Return to the country of origin or another member state
